I have been asked to write my own history which feels a little bit like writing your own obituary.

Why Jack?

There were three Johns in my family. My grandfather was John, and his oldest son was John and when I arrived was also named John. So to avoid confusion my uncle was called Jack and I was called Jackie until I became older and it

didn't fit and I also became Jack.

So I am only John G. on legal documents I was born in Kelowna in October of 1922. Both my parents were from pioneer families. My mother and her family came to the Okanagan 1910 and my father and his family in 1895. We pioneer families are in the minority now, with most of the folks living in the valley today arriving after the Second World War. My father grew up in a farm surrounding and farmed in the early part of his life. He changed to logging in the mid-20s when agriculture went into recession. So much

of my childhood was spent in small logging camps, in the days when horses were used and crosscut saws and double bitted axes reigned supreme. Yellow Pine was the wood of the day and as the stands were small, we moved frequently. I have attended school in most of the communities from Kelowna north to Vernon and down the west side of Okanagan Lake. I was back in Kelowna for Grade 9 and 10. In the summer of 1940 my family decided to move to the Lower Mainland. This meant that if I wished to continue my education, I would have to move again. My decision was to stay and go to work....Pg2

"You don't want to fly?"

During the winter of 1942 my next major decision was to join the armed services. When I told my boss, George Weeden, of my decision, he said: "You know, Jack, I have had the same idea." So we set about selling off the business and by early summer we had it all cleaned up. George joined the Army as a mechanic and I joined the Air Force. When I was at the recruiting office, they asked me what I wanted to do. I replied, "Aero Engine Mechanic." Sounding somewhat surprised, they asked, "Don't you want to fly?" I replied, "Sure, but I don't have my Grade 11." "That is not a problem. We can fix that." To this answered: "Let's fly then!"

Wedding Bells are ringing

Frances Tutt. With a two-weeks leave and a posting to eastern Ontario, time was short. I had to make a stop in Calgary to purchase my officer's kit and a wedding ring. Frances had week together and then I was back on the train east again.

I met Fran in Kelowna when we ended up in the same Grade 9 class and she stole my heart then and never gave it back. Together we raised eight girls and two boys and they in turn have increased the family to 114 souls. The Lord has been good to us in the 68 years we were married. We have only lost three of those souls, a baby grand daughter, just

before her birth, in a car accident; Fran in her eightieth year; we also a son-in-law to a stroke.

Work—work--work

I was discharged and returned home. Fran met me at the station and right behind her was my old boss, George. He had been released earlier and was in the process of building a garage and wanted me to come and help. I agreed and within a week I was back at work. We first built a service business, then took on a dealership for cars and trucks. I filled many roles in the business: mechanic, parts man, and then shop foreman.

In late 1948, George came down with TB and ended up in a sanitarium. The prognosis was for a long recovery period, so the decision to sell was made. This took up most of 1949, and

opened up in Vernon on January 15, 1961. The business grew from then until 1975, my partners—who were both older—retired and I was the only one left. I carried on the business till 1985, when I sold it to three of my employees. In 1989, the three partners failed, so I formed a new company called "Tri Star Engine

I joined Fr. Pandosy Council in Kelowna in September 1947. At that time there were only two councils in the Valley—one in Kamloops and the other in Kelowna. In September of this year I will have been a Knight for 64 years. During that time the expansion in Catholic population and the Knights has been amazing. What has Knighthood meant for me? A host of friendships that I might not have had and much learning as well. All you need to do is to look at the accomplishments of Council 4949 for church and community to realize that when we join together we can accomplish much. That is what the Church and the Knights have given me, a great faith in God's goodness and a host of good friends.

I would like to finish these lines with a word of wisdom from a very dear friend and neighbour who was some 30 years my senior. As I was saying good bye to her before moving to Vernon, I said: "I am going to miss you and all my old friends." Her reply was: "Jack, I don't know about you young folks, but we old folks have a saying: *"God and good people are everywhere."*

Formal Comment
on HHS Mandate**

The Knights of Columbus filed a formal comment with the United States Department of Health and Human Services today, calling on the government to rethink the unpopular healthcare Mandate that seeks to force many Catholic employers to cover interventions that violate their faith without regard for the First Amendment's guarantee of the free exercise of religion.

The letter, signed by Supreme Knight Carl Anderson, urged "the Administration to rescind the Mandate altogether," or at least "to expand the religious exemption so that it covers all objecting individuals and organizations from cooperating in actions that genuinely offend their religious beliefs and moral convictions."

"To exempt only some institutions on the principle of respect for religious liberty, as the Government seems to contemplate, and to refuse to exempt individuals makes no sense. The right to the free exercise of religion enshrined in the First Amendment extends to the people," the letter says.

In the letter, the Knights noted that the Mandate "requires private Catholic individuals and entities, including organizations such as the Knights of Columbus, to violate their most deeply held religious beliefs," and that "it appears to do so in violation of federal law and the First Amendment of the Constitution." The letter also pointed out that "it is improper to deny statutory and First Amendment rights to religious liberty in order to create an entitlement to sterilization, abortifacients, and contraception."

The letter makes clear that "there is no reason why the Affordable Care Act

should not conform to those protections that exist in other contexts throughout the law, both at the state and federal level, and have stood for decades." In sum, the letter urges that "whatever the intent of the Mandate, and whatever form it takes, it should not compel religious individuals to pay for what they believe is morally wrong. It is time for this Administration to chart another course."

The full text of the letter is available at www.kofc.org/Mandate For the past century, the Knights of Columbus has worked diligently to protect the right to religious freedom both in the United States and abroad.

The Knights of Columbus is also one of the nation's most active charitable groups and the world's largest Catholic fraternal group with 1.8 million members worldwide – the vast majority of whom reside in the United States. Last year the Knights donated more than \$158 million and 70 million hours to charitable causes.

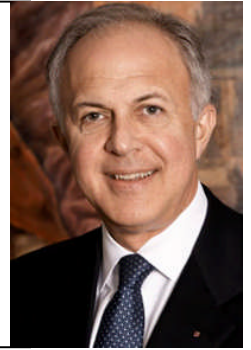

The witness of Knights during the persecution of the Church in Mexico provides lessons as we defend religious freedom today.

During my recent trip to Korea, I had the opportunity to pray at the Jeoldusan Martyrs' Shrine overlooking the Han River in Seoul. On that site, as many as 10,000 Korean Catholics were martyred in the 1860s, nearly two decades before the founding of the Knights of Columbus. These ordinary men and women of extraordinary faith were tortured and decapitated, and their bodies were then thrown over the cliff into the river. Catholics in Korea will tell you that this is one of the most sacred places in their country. I believe it is one of the most sacred places in the world.

Today, South Korea has one of the fastest growing Catholic populations, with thousands of converts to the faith each year. We see there once again the mystery of salvation. The blood of the martyrs is the seed of the Church.

It was an especially moving experience for me to be there since I had arrived in Seoul from Washington, D.C., after delivering an address at the National Catholic Prayer Breakfast on the new threats to religious liberty in the United States.

My visit to the Jeoldusan Shrine brought home the truth of what our bishops have recently written: "Religious liberty is not only about our ability to go to Mass on Sunday

or pray the rosary at home. It is about whether we can make our contribution to the common good of all Americans."

The U.S. bishops have sounded a warning of emerging threats to religious liberty, threats to the integrity and continued existence of many Catholic institutions. The bishops ask, "Can we do the good works our faith calls us to do without having to compromise that very same faith?" This question must be of utmost concern to every Catholic and especially to the Knights of Columbus.

The bishops have directed a clear call to action: "Once more we see the need for an engaged, articulate and well-formed Catholic laity endowed with a strong critical sense ... and with the courage to counter a reductive secularism which would delegitimize the Church's participation in public debate about the issues which are determining the future of American society."

As Knights of Columbus, we are proud of our reputation as "the strong right arm of the Church." In 130 years, that arm has never tired, nor has it wavered. I am confident that in the days ahead we will increase our efforts to shield the Church and her institutions from the heavy hand of those who now seek to restrict what Pope Benedict XVI has called "that most cherished of

American freedoms, the freedom of religion."

I urge every brother Knight and every state and local council to participate in the upcoming "Fortnight for Freedom" from June 21 to July 4 by contacting their local parish and diocese in support of this program.

And I ask every K of C family to take part in a novena for religious liberty beginning June 21, using the prayer that our bishops have asked us to pray:

Almighty God, Father of all nations, for freedom you have set us free in Christ Jesus (Gal 5:1). We praise and bless you for the gift of religious liberty, the foundation of human rights, justice, and the common good. Grant to our leaders the wisdom to protect and promote our liberties; By your grace may we have the courage to defend them, for ourselves and for all those who live in this blessed land. We ask this through the intercession of Mary Immaculate, our patroness, and in the name of your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, with whom you live and reign, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Together we can safeguard our most cherished freedom.
