#### **Dear Brother Knights:**

Every Year Jews gather around the world to celebrate Passover, as they have been doing for thousands of years. During the ritual meal of Passover, the youngest person in the household asks the question, "Why is this

night different from all other nights?"

In response to this question, an adult will relate how Moses led the Israelite people out of their bondage in Egypt, to the land God would give them as his covenanted people. This event


was commemorated in the Passover meal, celebrated with a roasted lamb, bitter herbs, unleavened bread and wine.

Almost two thousand



years ago, an itinerant preacher and teacher gathered in Jerusalem with twelve of his followers to celebrate the Passover. During this ancient ritual, however, this preacher, Jesus, gave this meal a whole new and expanded meaning. This meal would now commemorate nothing less than the Passover from death to life which he was now about to inaugurate through his own passion, suffering and death, culminating in his resurrection.

This new Passover would make his resurrection our own through him.



We will celebrate this Passover—Easter in this month. Easter is the reason why we Christians gather on Sunday to celebrate the Mass-our Passover. Easter is the great Sunday of Sundays, our foretaste of future glory which Christ Jesus has made possible for us.

We, like the Israelites being led through the desert, are being brought to our promised land--heaven. We are being led by the new Moses--Jesus. The Israelites' forty years of wandering are recalled in our forty days of lent, which lead us to Easter and hope in resurrected glory made possible by Christ Jesus.

May this Lenten Season reinvigorate your hope and desire for this resurrection as we prepare for Easter .

## OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE



"The Our Lady of Guadalupe Prayer Program began August 3 at the 129th Supreme Convention in Denver.

This program features an image of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Our Lady of Guadalupe, as patroness of the Americas, has special significance to the Knights of Columbus. When the Order sponsored a tour of a relic of St. Juan Diego's tilma in 2003, Our Lady of Guadalupe's role as mother of all in the Americas became very clear. In city after city, crowds of tens of thousands of people came to venerate Our Lady of Guadalupe. What was most striking was not the number of people, but the number of nationalities and ethnicities represented in each gathering. Likewise, at the Guadalupe Festival sponsored by the Knights of Columbus in 2009 in Phoenix, more than 20,000 people came to venerate and celebrate Our



Lady of Guadalupe. It is our Council Dire

hope that this prayer program will continue to expand devotion to Our Lady and the evangelization of the Americas."



"Easter (Old English: Ēostre: Greek: Πάσχα, Paskha; Hebrew: ND 9 "Passover") is the Pesakh, central feast in the Christian liturgical year. According to the Canonical gospels, Jesus rose from the dead on the third day after his crucifixion. We as Catholics celebrate this resurrection on Easter Day or Sunday (also Resurrection Day or Resurrection Sunday.

Easter is linked to the Jewish Passover by much of its symbolism, as well as by its position in the calendar. In most European languages the feast called Easter in Englishis termed by the words for Passover in those languages and in the older English versions of the Bible the term Easter was the term used to translate Passover."...




